EDUCATIONAL PURPOSE

Established in 1860 to educate men and women from diverse ethnic backgrounds in the United States and abroad, Wheaton is a private, residential, and interdenominational Christian liberal arts college. Committed to the principle that truth is revealed by God through Jesus Christ, "in whom are hid all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge" (Colossians 2:3). Wheaton College seeks to relate Christian liberal arts education to contemporary society. The curricular approach integrates faith, learning, and life to produce the biblical perspective needed to generate a Christian response to global needs.

The founders of the College and their successors have consistently maintained that academic excellence and evangelical Christian faith and practice are essential to the high purpose of doing everything for Christ and His Kingdom.

STATUS AND ACCREDITATION

A residential, coeducational, Christian liberal arts college, Wheaton is owned and operated by a self-perpetuating board incorporated in the State of Illinois as "The Trustees of Wheaton College."

Wheaton College is known for its Christ-centered academic rigor, commitment to the liberal arts, and students who are motivated to work with world-renowned professors and similarly minded classmates. The average ACT score is 29 and SAT score is 1320. The freshman-sophomore retention rate is typically above 90% and the 6-year graduation rate ranges from 88-90%. Wheaton ranks 20th overall in doctoral degrees attained by graduates in the latest National Science Foundation survey and is ranked 61st by US News & World Report out of more than 225 liberal arts colleges. Wheaton offers over 40 undergraduate majors, 15 master degrees and three doctoral degrees. As a residential college, the majority of undergraduate students are involved in a wide variety of co-curricular activities with over 20% of students engaged in intercollegiate athletics and 800 students participating in Conservatory ensembles and other musical programs.

Evangelical in outlook and nondenominational in ecclesiology, the student body consists of approximately 2,300 undergraduates and 700 graduate students representing all 50 states, over 50 countries, and more than 30 church denominations. More than 10% of our graduate enrollment is comprised of international students; nearly 80% of undergraduate students come from outside of Illinois. As stated in our strategic priorities, Wheaton College is committed to increasing the enrollment of international students as well as students of color. For our undergraduate enrollment, typically 5% are international students (F-1 visa) and 10% are missionary kids (MKs) or third culture kids (TCKs). Students of color from the United States represent roughly 30% of the undergraduate student body. We strive for equal enrollment of men and women.

The Wheaton faculty, comprised of over 200 full-time members with 93% percent having earned doctorates, comes from a variety of top universities in the United States and abroad. As active Christians and committed local church members, they are personally invested in the spiritual as well as the intellectual development of their students.





Wheaton offers undergraduate programs leading to the Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Music, and Bachelor of Music Education degrees. Graduate degree programs are offered leading to Master of Arts in Bible, Theology and Church History, Master of Arts in Clinical Psychology, Master of Arts in Teaching, Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.), Doctor of Psychology (Psy.D.), and Doctor of Ministry (D.Min.). The College is accredited by The Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools, as well as by the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP) and the Commission on Accreditation for Marriage and Family Therapy Education (COAMFTE); the Doctor of Psychology program is accredited by the Committee on Accreditation of the American Psychological Association. The College is also a member of the National Association of Schools of Music (NASM) and a leader in the Christian College Consortium (CCC) and Council for Christian Colleges and Universities (CCCU).



WHAT IT'S LIKE TO LIVE IN WHEATON, ILLINOIS

Wheaton's 80-acre campus is located in Wheaton, Illinois, just 25 miles west of Chicago. Only a five-minute walk to downtown Wheaton, and a 30-minute train ride to downtown Chicago, a student at Wheaton enjoys the benefits of life of a college town, and living only a train ride away from the third largest city in the United States.

The city of Wheaton was established as a small railroad community in the late 1850s. It is now home to 55,000 residents and a variety of shops and restaurants.

Student favorites in downtown Wheaton include Egglectic Café, Shane's Deli and the French Market on Saturday mornings. Wheaton is also home to one of the top ten public libraries in the nation and 52 parks. Students can enjoy beautiful lakes and forest preserves year-round. Nearby suburbs of Glen Ellyn and Naperville are other student favorites for restaurants, stores, and coffee shops.

Downtown Chicago

Wheaton's campus is a block away from the College Ave train station where students can purchase an affordable weekend pass to downtown Chicago.

Full of parks, museums, and other cultural sights such as the Lyric Opera and sport stadiums like Wrigley Field, students regularly take advantage of Wheaton's close proximity to this great city. Wheaton College also offers many Chicago based programs and outreaches including Wheaton in Chicago, Urban Ministries and Chicago Evangelism Team.

- Directs the undergraduate chapel program and oversees the graduate chapel program, leading students to worship the Triune God.
- Preaches God's Word monthly in chapel and speaks as requested at College-related activities.
- Provides pastoral care and spiritual counsel for students, faculty, and staff.
- Encourages an institutional emphasis on prayer through planning and programming with students, faculty, and staff.
- Provides overall supervision for the Student Chaplains, Chapel Bands, and Discipleship Ministries.
- Collaborates with Student Development in providing ministry opportunities and caring for student needs.
- Facilitates connections with diverse evangelical churches and encourages strong student commitments to local congregations.
- Serves on the President's Advisory Council on Sexual Identity.

- Displays a vibrant testimony of authentic faith in Christ and a heart for people that draws students, faculty, and staff into personal friendship and inspires them to follow Jesus.
- Finds personal identity in Jesus Christ in ways that foster holiness, humility, compassion, joy, perseverance, courage, and good humor.
- Lives in genuine dependence on the Holy Spirit and cultivates a life of prayer.
- Sustains a deep commitment to the evangelical theology of Wheaton's Statement of Faith and exemplifies the moral commitments in Wheaton's Community Covenant.

- Wholeheartedly supports the curricular and co-curricular academic mission of Wheaton as a liberal arts college and graduate school and earns the respect of faculty and others by engaging the life of the mind under the lordship of Jesus Christ.

- Casts vision, builds consensus, and empowers a gifted ministry team that thoughtfully and creatively plans more than one hundred worship services and oversees a campus-wide discipleship program that reaches as many as a thousand students each year.

- Offers skilled, sensitive pastoral counsel to students and others who need biblical insight, personal care, and spiritual direction, especially in times of difficulty or distress.
- Provides calm, comforting leadership through crises that affect the emotional and spiritual well-being of the campus community.
- Gives wise pastoral guidance and astute, well-informed theological counsel to the College in navigating complex, controversial issues at the intersection of Christianity and culture.
- Communicates clearly to diverse audiences through the written and spoken word.
